- 1. Clive Relf of Kreston Reeves, Chair of the Board welcomed attendees
- 2. The accounts for 2014-15 tabled at the meeting, available here and they were received without comment.
 - Clive Relf highlighted the following two points:
 - i. A surplus from the first year of £128,683. This is the result of the delay in procuring a number of the contracts until the middle of the year e.g. the Ambassador team, and the surplus will be invested in projects for the benefit of levy payers over the balance of this BID term. This year we have already invested an additional £30,000 in Christmas lights.
 - ii. The need to go out to tender for services currently provided to the BID by companies which are represented on the BID Board: accountancy (Clive Relf, Kreston Reeves), legal services (Jeremy Licence, Furley Page) and IT Services (Alex Ridings, Think Agency). This situation is a legacy of the development of the BID and its forerunner, Canterbury City Partnership and will be resolved for the start of the BID's third year in October 2016 in order to demonstrate transparency and best value for levy payers.



- 3. Membership Membership forms were made available at the meeting along with an explanatory note. Anyone wishing to apply to become a Member of the Company can complete the form and the Board will consider their application in due course. Only Members are permitted to vote at an AGM and this is currently restricted to the Board. Any application for membership received on the evening (and subsequently) will be considered by the Board to ensure only those eligible are accepted.
- 4. Annual review Bob Jones, Chief Executive of Canterbury Connected BID gave a presentation on what the BID has delivered since it started in October 2014. The presentation is available to view here. This was followed by and Question and Answer session and the questions raised were as follows:
 - Communication with levy payers
 - Business rate review in 2017
 - Funding opportunities for project
 - Funding opportunities for traders associations
 - Transport and access
 - Wi-Fi
- 5. Any other Business there was no other business and members remained to talk to the Board and the BID team.
